## **GUIDELINES**

**PERMITS:** The following permits are available:

**Sod Watering** - for those who have installed a new

lawn, either newly seeded or new sod.

Power Washing - Available to a building owner or lessee which has a business license.

Water Mister – Available to a company which has a business license.

- Permits available at the Town office.
- Permits will NOT be issued during Stage 3 & 4 restrictions.

**EXEMPTIONS:** Watering of public sports fields, turf farms, and golf courses;

- Commercial Car washes so long as each wash does not exceed 57L of water;

- Under authority of permit issued by the Bylaw;

- People who by reason of physical or mental incapacity that are unable to water their property within the restricted days and times may water their property on any two day a week for a maximum of 8 hours per day.

Watering of flower and vegetable gardens, decorative planters, shrubs and trees using micro-irrigation, drip-irrigation, or a hose with an automatic shut off nozzle.

Town Staff will be adjusting the water schedule in Town Parks to align with Restrictions.

**ENFORCEMENT:** Bylaw Enforcement Officers have the authority to enter at all reasonable times on any property that is subject to the bylaw to ascertain if the bylaw requirements are being violated.

FINES: The penalty for not complying with the bylaw will result in a Municipal Ticket being issued.

Each date that a contravention of the bylaw exists or is permitted to exist constitutes a separate offence.

# WATER RESTRICTION STAGES ST

Guidelines	AUTOMATICALLY Controlled Underground Sprinkling Systems (Residential and Commercial) Properties equipped with an automated time clock sprinkler system may sprinkle between the hours of <u>12:00</u> <u>MIDNIGHT to 6:00 AM</u> on the days permitted by the stages.		
	MANUALLY Controlled Sprinklers (Residential and Commercial) Properties equipped with only manually controlled sprinkling systems, including those attached to outside taps, may operate from <u>6:00 AM to 10:00 AM</u> and from <u>7:00 PM to 12:00 MIDNIGHT</u> on the days permitted by the stages.		
	<ul> <li>NO sprinkling between the hours of 10:00 AM and 7:00 PM during any day at any time of the year.</li> <li>NO use of water to wash sidewalks, driveways or parking lots, except if necessary for applying a product such as paint or preservative.</li> </ul>		

	<ul> <li>NO use of water to wash sidewalks, driveways or parking lots, except if necessary for applying a product such as paint or preservative.</li> <li>Only one ½" (9mm) diameter outlet (outside tap) may be used at one time for sprinkling, and furthermore, it is not permissible to use an open pipe or hose for irrigating purposes.</li> </ul>		
Normal	DAYS OF WATERING Sprinkling is only permitted at residential, commercial and other non-agricultural properties as follows →	<b>EVEN numbered addresses:</b> Watering is only permitted on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturday's during the times described above. <b>ODD numbered addresses:</b> Watering is only permitted on Wednesday's, Friday's and Sunday's during the times described above. <b>NO</b> use of water hoses permitted for the purpose of washing boats or motor vehicles unless the spray gun or spray wand <u>are equipped with an automatic shut</u> <u>off nozzle</u> .	
Stage 1	TWICE A WEEK WATERING Sprinkling is only permitted at residential, commercial and other non-agricultural properties as follows →	<b>EVEN Numbered Addresses:</b> Watering is only permitted on Saturdays and Tuesdays during the times described above. <b>ODD Numbered Addresses:</b> Watering is only permitted on Sundays and Wednesdays during the times described above. <b>NO</b> washing a vehicle or boat.	
Stage 2	ONCE A WEEK WATERING Sprinkling is only permitted at residential, commercial and other non-agricultural properties as follows →	<ul> <li>EVEN numbered addresses: Watering is only permitted on Saturdays during the times described above.</li> <li>ODD numbered addresses: Watering is only permitted on Sundays during the times described above.</li> <li>NO filling a swimming pool, hot tub, garden pond or decorative fountain at any time</li> <li>NO washing a vehicle or boat.</li> </ul>	
Stage 3	NO LAWN WATERING →	<b>NO</b> sprinkling or irrigating any lawn or boulevard; <b>NO</b> filling a swimming pool, hot tub, garden pond or decorative fountain at any time; or <b>NO</b> washing a vehicle or a boat.	
Stage 4	Emergency – NO OUTDOOR WATERING ->	<b>NO</b> person shall use water outdoors for any purpose.

• Water when the sun is low, winds are calm and temperatures are cooler (see staged restrictions).

#### Divide by zones

- Different plants need different amounts of water.
- Divide your yard and landscape areas into separate irrigation zones so that grass can be watered separately and more frequently than groundcovers, shrubs and trees.
- Both sprinkler and drip irrigation can be incorporated to achieve more efficient use of water.

## Water only things that grow

 If you have an underground sprinkler system, make sure the sprinkler heads are adjusted properly to avoid watering sidewalks and driveways.

#### Do routine inspections

• Periodically check your sprinklers to make sure everything is working properly.

#### Be rain smart

• Adjust your irrigation system as the seasons and weather change.

Also may be published by other means as determined by the CAO.

#### My water is discoloured what can/should I do?

You may be experiencing discoloured water due to the increased water usage that occurs in the spring, don't be alarmed.

- Run a cold faucet for about 10-15 minutes or until the water clears.
- Do not use a hot water tap as doing so may draw sediment into your hot water tank.
- Do not choose a faucet with a water filter connected to it, as sediment may clog the filter.

# How often is the water being tested? And by whom?

The testing of water samples is done weekly by CARO Analytical Services located in Kelowna.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**
